THE MISSING LINK COOKIE POLICY

We've put together a Cookie Policy to explain how The Missing Link uses cookies to recognise when you visit our websites (www.themissinglink.com.au, www.themissinglink.co.uk). This policy explains what cookies are and why we use them, and your rights to control the use of cookies while on our website.

You can change your cookie settings and disable some or all cookies for our website at any time in your browser settings.

1 What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files of data used to identify your computer as you use a computer network. While on our website, these tokens of information are stored in your browser and used to manage, personalise and track your session. Cookies are then sent back to our website on each subsequent visit to improve our website's performance, enhance your browsing experience and protect the website against spam.

To put it simply, cookies are a bit like dropping your car at valet parking.

- 1. The keys for your car that you give to the valet would be the data we collect (e.g., your company's name from one of our forms, or even just what pages you've visited).
- 2. The ticket you get to identify you as the car owner would be the unique cookie for our website stored in your web browser.
- 3. When you return to collect your car with a ticket, your browser gives our website a unique cookie so we can assemble your activity data and remember your preferences.

Cookies can remain on your device for different periods of time. Some cookies only exist while the browser is open; these are called "session cookies". These cookies are deleted automatically once you close your browser. Other cookies called "permanent cookies" survive after your browser is closed.

2 What types of cookies do we use?

There are two broad categories of cookies: first-party and third-party cookies. Cookies set by us to your device are called first-party cookies, and cookies served by a third party on our behalf are called third-party cookies.

Our website uses cookies that perform four functions, as classified below:

- Strictly necessary cookies: ensure the functioning of our website.
- Performance cookies: help us measure the performance of our website to improve your experience constantly.

Note: we do not store any personal data; all information collected is anonymised form.

- Functionality cookies: allow us to enhance your experience.
- Advertising/targeting cookies: used to track your activity and sessions to deliver personalised service and advertisements.
- Social media cookies: allow you to share content on social media channels.

3 How can I control cookies?

When landing on our website, you're allowed to accept all the cookies used on our website, accept specific categories of cookies and not others, or decline all cookies. At any time, you can change your cookie preferences in your browser settings.

If you choose to reject our cookies, don't worry, we won't kick you out, you may still use our website; however, some functionality and areas of our website may be restricted.

Note: essential cookies cannot be declined as they're strictly necessary to deliver our website to you; however, these can be blocked or deleted by changing your browser settings.



4 What about other tracking technologies, like pixels?

Cookies are not the only way we recognise or track visitors to our website. We also use social media pixels, which are codes that we place on our website. These codes collect data that helps us track conversions to build and optimise ads and remarket to people who have already taken action on our website.
